Results will be posted on the HHSAA website, www.sportshigh.com, following the conclusion of the competition.

The Hawaii High School Athletic Association (HHSAA) and the Civilian Marksmanship Program (CMP) will conduct the 16th annual boys and girls air riflery state championships. The 2014 individual and team champions will be shot on, Tuesday, October 28, at the Neal Blaisdell Exhibition Hall.

Individual champions for 2013 was Justin Gray (boys) from Waiakea High and Nadia Hata (girls) from Maryknoll High. Pearl City High won their first girls team championship in 2013.

History of Air Riflery in Hawaii High Schools:

HHSAA Sporter Air Riflery championships began in 1999. Konawaena High School hosted the first state tournament. Other sites were St. Louis First Sgt. Joseph Silva Range, Dole Cannery and Kamehameha Schools Hawaii. The Maui Interscholastic League will host their first tournament in 2015.

While there is some variation among the leagues on team size and selection processes to the state championship all utilize the Sporter air rifle in 3-position competition as a fall sport. Precision air rifles are not allowed. League competition, with the exception of Maui, is primarily team-based with an individual championship ending the season.



Hawaii's state championship is one of two in the U.S. that are sanctioned by the high school athletic governing body. Georgia is the other state with a sanctioned championship.

Shooters fire 20 record shots in each of the prone, standing and kneeling positions. A perfect score is 600. Teams are made up of four firing members from the same school.

Civilian Marksmanship Program:

It is the mission of the Civilian Marksmanship Program to promote firearm safety and marksmanship training with special emphasis on youths. For more information on CMP, log on to www.odcmp.com.



TOURNAMENT PROCEDURE

All 60 competitors in each gender fire in three positions: prone, kneeling and standing. Shooters fire 20 shots in each position.

All competitors shoot at the same time, beginning with the prone position. The targets are 32 feet 9.7 inches (10 meters) away.

Twenty minutes are allowed for prone shooting. When completed the targets are retrieved and standing targets are mounted.

There is a five-minute changeover period between shooting positions to prepare for the next phase.

Twenty-five minutes are allowed for standing shooting. When completed, those targets are retrieved and kneeling targets are mounted.

Twenty minutes are allowed for kneeling shooting.

RULES & SCORING

All competitors use CMP approved Sporter type air rifles.

Shooters fire 20 shots in each position. A bulls-eye scores 10 points and each ring out from the center scores fewer points.

The maximum points possible in individual competition are 600. The HHSAA Championships records are 553 points for boys and 557 points for girls. The girls record is 557.

Team scores are drawn from a team's four highest scorers. The team scoring records are 2,129 points for boys and 2,130 points for girls.
