III. TEAM SKILLS SHEETS

The official 12-page HHSAA Skills Sheet must be completed and emailed to the State Coordinator, Travis Mukina (travis.mukina@chaminade.edu) by Sunday November 6th at 12 p.m. Failure to do so will result in a zero for Stunt Difficulty, Pyramid Difficulty, Standing Tumbling Difficulty, Running Tumbling, Difficulty, and Jump Difficulty sections of the respective team's score sheet.

IV. USA CHEER MUSIC LICENSE

A copy of the team's official USA Music Producer License must be emailed to the Cheer Administrator, Natalie Iwamoto (iwamoto@hhsaa.org) by November 6th at 12 p.m. Failure to do so will result in a team not being permitted to be use music during the tournament performance.

V. POINTS OF EMPHASIS

A. Sportsmanship

The NFHS Spirit Rule 2.2.1 on sportsmanship will be strictly enforced during the entire tournament. Any incident that draws attention to noteworthy citizenship (good or bad), will be reported to the HHSAA and corresponding league within 48 hours of occurrence. Unsportsmanlike infractions include, but are not limited to, incidence of crowd disturbance, undesirable behavior, entering restricted areas such as judges' meeting rooms or the judging area, and/or disparaging posts on social media.

B. Judges' Decision

Per the HHSAA Cheerleading Handbook Rule III-A, the decision of the judges is final.

C. Spectator Regulations

During team performances, only the following are permitted to be in the lower section in front of the performance floor:

- Two coaches
- Two alternates in full uniform

Anyone not in the categories above must remain in the upper section of the competition and respective team performance.

CHEERLEADING

I. SPECIFIC OBJECTIVES

- A. To select state cheerleading champions through competition.
- B. To recognize the combined efforts of all the participating teams in the tournament.
- C. To encourage the highest principles and standards of general behavior.
- D. To emphasize respect for opponents.
- E. To promote the highest principles of sportsmanship in competition.

II. JUDGES

- A. All judges must be impartial and will not have any direct ties and/or relationship with any of the schools participating in the State Competition for a minimum of three (3) years.
- B. The judges' panel shall consist of the following:
 - 1. Building skills judge(s) for stunting, pyramid, execution
 - 2. Tumbling & jumps judge(s) for standing tumbling, running tumbling, jumps and execution
 - 3. Overall judge for dance, showmanship, formations, transitions and creativity
 - 4. Cheer judge for prop usage, ability to lead the crowd, voice/flow of words, use of skills to lead the crowd and execution.
 - 5. Up to three safety judges
 - 6. Head Judge
 - 7. Timer
 - 8. Video recorder
- C. Shall be at least eighteen (18) years old with expertise in the fields of cheerleading and/or dance.

III. JUDGES DECISION

- A. The decision of the judges will be final.
- B. In case of a tie, refer to the current season's cheer rubric for tie breaking procedures.
- C. All final score sheets must be verified by the HHSAA Executive Director.

IV. ELIGIBILITY

- A. Each participant must be eligible under the rules of his/her league and under the eligibility requirements specified by the HHSAA.

V. RULES GOVERNING TOURNAMENT

The National Federation of State High School Associations' ("NFHS") Spirit Rules Book shall govern the tournament, with HHSAA and USA Cheer modifications as necessary.

VI. TOURNAMENT REPRESENTATION

- A. One-half (50%) of a league's cheerleading squads shall qualify for participation in the state tournament. With respect to any calculated league representation number ending in "0.5" (e.g., 2.5 squads), such number shall be rounded down to the nearest whole number (e.g., 2.5 squads rounded down to 2 squads).

VII. TOURNAMENT FORMAT

- A. Tournament Divisions

All Girl: teams composed solely of females

Coed: teams with a combination of males and females

- B. The performance order will be determined by seeding based on in division of league championship scores. (Rev 6/2015)

C. Routine Specifications

1. Squads shall perform one routine that incorporates both cheer and dance.
2. Squads must provide a non-squad member to assist in the operation of the performance music.
3. All participating teams (competing and exhibition) must provide CHEER MUSIC LICENSING CERTIFICATE (Rev. 6/2022).
4. If a team's routine is interrupted due to failure of the competition equipment, facilities or other factors attributable to the competition rather than the team, the team affected will be allowed to restart its routine.
5. If there is a problem with the music it is the responsibility of the coach to contact the HHSAA State Cheerleading Coordinator immediately.

D. Timing

1. Each team will have two minutes and thirty seconds (2:30) of performance time. Squads must not exceed a maximum of one minute and thirty seconds (1:30) of music and must perform a minimum of forty-five (0:45) seconds for Cheer.
2. The first uniform movement, words, or first note of music, while on the performance mat will begin the overall time.
3. Timing will end with the last organized word, movement, or note of music by the team.
4. All squad participants must start their routine in the performance area with at least one foot on the ground. Following their introduction, squads may line up anywhere inside the performance area.
5. All routine entrances must be limited. Tumbling out, jumps, and brief crowd motivation will not be allowed. This should be brief.
6. Teams must exit the performance area immediately following their routine. No organized exits or other activities are allowed after the official ending of the routine.

E. Performance Area

1. All competition routines will take place within a matted 54ft. x 42ft area (9 mat panels). Mat panels will be placed with seams running toward the audience.
2. Tournament personnel will assist teams in moving from the warm-up area to the on-deck area. Squads may not enter onto the performance area until the tournament's announcer introduces them or directed by tournament personnel.
3. Once a team's name is called, the team may then enter the floor and set up all props. Props must immediately be picked up after the conclusion of the performance.
4. Signs, megaphones, poms, and flags are the only props allowed; however if your team is interested in using other props please get approval from HHSAA before use. Signs cannot be used in a theatrical manner, but rather, should have words or symbols associated with school spirit and/or game situations. Signs should not be used just to decorate the performance area, or used as a "break through" for theatrical purposes.

F. Safety Rules

1. All squads will be required to comply with the current NFHS Spirit Rules Book published by the National Federation of State High School Association.
2. Any squad found in violation of the NFHS Spirit Rules Book or tournament's requirements will be assigned a penalty for each infraction.
3. Additional Spotters: Squads will not be required to provide non-squad members as additional spotters for their routine. However, if squads choose to provide them, one per stunt group is preferred and spotters must be knowledgeable on squad's routine & capable in basic spotting. Further, the spotters must comply with all NFHS & HHSAA rules during the routine.
4. Cheerleading coaches are required to attain the NFHS Cheer and Dance Safety Certification in addition to a yearly review of the current NFHS safety guidelines as administered by the HHSAA cheerleading coordinator. (Rev. 6/2012)

VIII. SIZE OF SQUAD IN TOURNAMENT

Subject to the guidelines set forth in Section VI.A, schools may bring the following persons for complimentary admission into the state tournament: competing team members and TWO alternates (must be in uniform); two coaches; one performance music operator; and one athletic trainer. Names of the above-listed people must be listed on the official tournament roster form that must be signed by the school's athletic director. All other persons must purchase a ticket for entry into the state tournament.

Only persons listed on the roster will be permitted in the warm-up areas and in front of the competition floor during the performance.

IX. UNIFORMS

- A. NFHS Spirit Rules shall prevail.
- B. All squads must wear official school cheerleading uniforms during the tournament. No costumes are allowed in the tournament.

X. AWARDS AND TROPHIES

- A. All scores will be announced during the awards ceremony.
- B. Permanent trophies for the All Girl Division and the Coed Division champions and runner-up teams.
- C. 20 medals for championship team members.
- D. 20 medals for runner-up team members.
- E. Additional medals may be requested at the school's expense.

XI. STATE TOURNAMENT DISQUALIFICATION RULE

Any student-athlete or coach disqualified before, during, or after a state tournament game/match/event for unsportsmanlike conduct, flagrant verbal misconduct, or flagrant physical misconduct shall be disqualified from his/her next scheduled state tournament game/match/event for that sport. The student-athlete or coach has the right to appeal any such disqualification to an appeals committee for the particular sport. Should a student-athlete or coach be disqualified from the final state tournament game/match/event for that sport, said disqualification shall NOT carry over to the following school year's state tournament for that sport. Instead, the student-athlete's or coach's league shall determine any appropriate penalty or sanction.
